I use clean water and soap.


I wash my hands.

I wash my whole body.



When I wash the dirt from


my face, I look good.

- Draw a picture of your eyes.


My nose

I can smell harmful things, like Paraffin.




When I breathe, dirt is trapped in the nose.


Where does water come from?

You should never play near a place where there is water.


You might fall and hurt or break your body parts.

Count the number of cups as you fill the saucepan.


Which one holds more water?: the bowl or the saucepan.




UNIT 3: Animals around us


Can you name these animals?














Discuss with your friends:

- 6. Hens give us eggs.
- 7. They also give us meat.
- 8. Animals give us manure.

 Manure helps our plants to grow.
- 9. A farmer uses oxen to pull a plough.
 This makes work easier.

Pastoralists make sounds which animals learn.


The animals know what each sound means.

Before eating food that is not cooked, wash it clean.



Rhana is harmful to neonle



The sun is very bright. It is sunny.




There is a lot of rain. It is rainy and wet.

How does it affect your health? Do you fall sick when it is raining?




Which picture shows the weather today?



Look at the picture.



Some things have no smell.





Some things taste sour. Some things have no taste.



Close your eyes. Your friend will give you an object.


